



SCREENING TEST PREPARATION COURSES 2019

Distance at times often makes it difficult for individuals to access training opportunities. To assist individuals seeking NAATI certification, we have developed two online courses (hosted on the Totara Learning Management System) that can be accessed by anyone with a computer and internet connection.

These courses are meant to assist individuals preparing for the intercultural and ethical competency screening tests. They are not a replacement for tertiary qualifications and it is not compulsory to complete them. Completing these courses (on their own) will not be enough to satisfy the training requirements to access certification testing.

How to Enrol

In order enrol in both screening test preparation courses, you will need to follow these steps:

1. Click the link on the NAATI website to be taken to our [Totara LMS login page](#).
2. You will then need to register an account by clicking the 'create an account button' on the right hand side of the screen.
3. Once you have created an account, you will need to login and access the home page by clicking the 'home symbol' in the far left-hand side in the top menu bar.
4. Once you are on the home page, you simply need to click on the button to enrol.
5. You will then be prompted to make a PayPal payment to access the courses.
6. If your PayPal payment has been successful, you will receive a receipt via email. You will be able to access the courses (once they have started).

Do not enrol more than once as you will be charged the access fee each time you enrol.

Course Length & Dates

Each course should take around 10-15 hours to finish and must be completed within a 5 week period. You will also be given targets and encouragement to assist you to complete each course.

Please see the table below for course date details. Courses start 7 days after after enrolments open. Enrolments will close 7 days after each course starts. Learners who enrol after a course has started will not receive extra time to complete it.

- Android mobile browser: The latest stable release.
- Chrome for Android mobiles: The latest stable release.

Course Structure & Outlines

Each course is intended to be self-directed with some oversight by a course tutor. Course tutors will be available to answer general questions (posted within the course) and provide assessment and activity feedback.

Courses are structured in such a way that a learner must:

1. Go through the core content of each unit;
2. Complete the compulsory assessment and activity tasks (before accessing the end of course exam); and
3. Pass the end of course practice exam to gain a certificate of course completion.
